January 29, 2018 – Paddy Wales Mostly Sunny ~ Creating a Botanical Garden on the Sunshine Coast

Paddy Wales, author of Journeys Through the Garden (Whitecap), is one part garden photographer, one part garden writer, and one part garden maniac. Her images and written articles appear in national and international publications including Gardening Life, Canadian Gardening, House & Home, Style at Home, Fine Gardening, Chatelaine, and Pacific Horticulture, and in dozens of books, most recently The Holistic Garden, Creating a Cottage Garden, and The New Twelve-Month Gardener. Paddy is also a very active and


May 28, 2018 - Peter Light Management of Invasive Plants

September 24, 2018 - Dr. Carole Christopher Growing our own food/herbs for better nutrition

Carole has been gardening for nearly 35 years. She is a Director of SPEC (Society Promoting Environmental Conservation) which is Canada's oldest environmental organization, celebrating 45 years of community education and activism. Carole has taught many different types of gardening classes and has a broad knowledge base on the importance of protection of farm land and in equipping urban dwellers with skills of food growing as a means of mitigating the growing crisis in climate system break-down.



October 29, 2018 - Chris Kelly Trials and Tribulations of farming on the Sunshine Coast

Chris moved to the Sunshine Coast 5 years ago from the city and has spent most of that time working on his Pratt Road farm. His presentation will focus on the trials and tribulations of farming on the Sunshine Coast and share with you his journey. Chris spoke at the Gibsons Garden Club recently and his presentation was very well received.



November 26, 2018 - Andre Erasmus Seasonal Floral Arrangements - Indoors and Out

Andre Erasmus is a South African who emigrated here 30 yrs ago for love, not politics. He is a keen gardener with a love for flowers. He gives demos and floral design workshops to garden clubs, senior facilities, schools and pre-schools. Every Friday, during the summer for the past 5 yrs, Andre hosts a hands on workshop at his home where participants bring flowers and foliage from their gardens. His intention is to use as little commercial product as possible and to make his students aware of the abundance of indigenous flora. "Roadsidea" (his name for plants that grow along the roadside - wild



and FREE) makes him very happy! Andre is also an organist and choir master to a local parish.
